- As on 3 January, apart from 104 districts, all districts have reported one or more than one COVID-19 case during last seven days.
- India's active caseload currently stands at 1,71,830 and account for less than 1% of total cases, with recovery rate at 98.13%, 37,379 new cases in the past 24 hours; daily positivity rate (3.24%); and weekly positivity rate (2.05%) (Link)

- As of 11 January 2022, India reported a total of 35,875,790 confirmed cases. In the past 24 hours, 1,68,063 confirmed cases have been reported. Daily cases per million have increased five times since the past week to 95 but much lower in comparison to France (4052), UK (2501), USA (2026), and Brazil (155)
- Test positivity rates across the States is steadily increasing; on WCO warning level dashboard, 651 Districts are in level-4 (an addition of 226 districts in last 7 days).
- As of 10 January 2022, a total of 4033 cases of Omicron have been reported in India; highest number reported from Maharashtra (1216) followed by Rajasthan (529) and Delhi (513)

- As of 18 January 2022, India reported a total of 37,618,271 confirmed cases. In the past 24 hours, 2,38,018 confirmed cases have been reported with 182 daily cases per million population, which is almost twice in comparison to last week (12-18 January), but lower in comparison to France (4395), USA (2065), UK (1440) and Brazil (320).
- As of 19 January 2022, a total of 8209 cases of Omicron have been reported in India; highest number reported from Maharashtra (1738) followed by West Bengal (1672) and Rajasthan (1276).
- Over the last two weeks most districts have turned to warning level-4 (see maps below).

## **COVID-19: STATUS ACROSS STATES**

- Top five states, namely, Maharashtra, Kerala, Karnataka, Tamil Nadu, and Andhra Pradesh contributed 54% of total cases and during last seven days 17,42,481 cases were recorded with Maharashtra, documenting the highest number of cases (2,89,407, 17% of total cases) followed by Karnataka (1,83,587) and Delhi (1,53,601).
- A & N Islands reported a fall of 7% while Jharkhand reported a fall of 4% in cases during last week.

## **INDIA SITUATION**

As of 25 January 2022, India reported a total of 39,799,202 confirmed cases and since past 24 hours, 2,55,874 confirmed cases have been reported with 28,008 cases per million and is among the top 3 in the world after USA and France. Over 227 daily cases per million population was documented this week much lower in comparison to previous week to France (5,307), USA (2,047), UK (1,356) and Brazil (701).



## **COVID-19: STATUS ACROSS STATES**

- Top five states, Maharashtra, Kerala, Karnataka, Tamil Nadu, and Andhra Pradesh contributed 56% of total cases and in the past seven days, Karnataka reported the highest number of cases (3,16,865, 15% of total cases) followed by Maharashtra (2,92,590) and Kerala (2,67,834).
- In the past week (19-25 Jan.), as compared to previous week (12-18 Jan.), 26 states have shown an increase in cases, while nine states have shown a decline in cases. Larger declines were reported from West Bengal (-53%), Delhi (-51%), Jharkhand (-46%) and Bihar.
- Top ten districts reporting highest number of cases during last week have all shown increase in number of cases.
